Technical Manager (SLTV)

Introduction

Sheffield Live TV is the new local television channel for Sheffield co-located with Sheffield Live community radio and part of a new cross media platform for the local community. SLTV is a partner in Digital Media Exchange (DME), a project managed by a consortium of partners and part funded by the European Union through the Yorkshire and Humber ERDF Programme 2007-2013. DME is designed to promote jobs and enterprise by supporting digital media entrepreneurs to engage in cross-platform production for radio, television, web and mobile, building on existing infrastructure previously supported by ERDF and benefiting from investment in a new local television channel for Sheffield.

The Technical Manager will provide support in the use of studio and mobile audio visual equipment and facilities as part of the delivery of Action 3 of the Digital Media Exchange (DME) project, including induction and supervision of new users, coordination of technical assistance, assuring the smooth functioning of equipment and software and maintaining production, broadcast and network systems.

The Technical Manager will report to the Project Manager.

Job Description

- 1. To manage and maintain audio visual facilities, assuring the smooth running of studios and the checking of all portable equipment before and after use by supported businesses.
- 2. To oversee the procurement and installation of additional audio visual facilities for the Digital Media Exchange including TV broadcast and production studio and mixing console.
- 3. To provide induction to the technical facilities and to provide technical guidance and support to start-up enterprises using the Sheffield Live facilities for business development and broadcast.
- 4. To provide technical assistance to the development of the Sheffield Live workflow from preparation through recording post production, scheduling, playout and publication.
- 5. To provide technical support for the location based production and distribution of audio visual content by neighbourhood and community based social enterprises.
- 6. To undertake such other tasks as may be reasonably required.

In carrying out these duties the post holder will be required to respect all internal policies and procedures of Sheffield Live including on equal opportunities and health and safety.

This post has been part funded by the European Regional Development Fund as part of Europe's support for the region's economic development through the 2007-2013 Yorkshire and Humber ERDF Programme.

- Empathy with the ethos, aims and objectives of Sheffield Live

- Skills and experience in web and mobile technologies
- Familiarity with news room operations and workflow
