Head of News (SLTV)

Introduction

Sheffield Live TV (SLTV) is the new local television channel for Sheffield co-located with Sheffield Live community radio and part of a new cross platform media offer for the local community. News programming will be at the heart of the new cross platform approach with regular bulletins on both radio and TV, a flagship early evening local TV news programme and a news feed to web and mobile.

The Head of News will be responsible for leading a team of radio, TV and online news reporters including news journalism apprentices, student reporters and community correspondents. They will build a network of sources including hyperlocal news partners and will build relations across the city with the public and private sector and with neighbourhood-based and specialist organisations.

The Head of News will report to the Programme Manager.

Job Description

1. To be responsible for leading the news team to deliver a daily suite of news stories for radio, TV and online, packaged bulletins for radio and TV, and a flagship daily TV news strand.
2. To convene the daily editorial conferences, identifying and selecting stories, planning and prioritising work assignments to the team and follow-up monitoring and supervision.
3. To coordinate a diverse team including news journalism apprentices, student reporters and community correspondents and engaging with a wide network of local news sources.
4. To ensure compliance checks for all news stories including with the Broadcasting Code.
5. To provide news quality control and to ensure effective and efficient news work flow.
6. To maintain good relations with BBC local and regional news managers and to ensure SLTV meets its targets for the delivery of diary stories on a daily basis to the BBC region.
7. To seek out other opportunities for news story syndication and revenue generation.
8. To maintain and assure a robust and accessible media asset management system to support news production including reliable systems for tagging, cataloguing and archiving.
9. To provide or organise training and mentoring for staff, student and volunteer reporters.
10. To undertake such other tasks as may be reasonably required.

In carrying out these duties the post holder will be required to respect all internal policies and procedures of Sheffield Live including on equal opportunities and health and safety.
